Back in 2017, ATG was in the early stages of pre-production for a powerful play entitled A GOOD FARMER by a wonderfully gifted playwright, Sharyn Rothstein. It was a compelling play about immigration, and we were chomping at the bit to go into auditions and start rehearsals. But before we sent out casting notices, Sharyn mentioned that another new play of hers was receiving a reading in NY.

At the intermission of the reading, before seeing the entire play, I went up to her and said something to the effect, 'We'll still do A GOOD FARMER, but if you want, we can do this play instead.' She convinced me that we should stick to the original plan, and that ATG could do RIGHT TO BE FORGOTTEN next.

"Next" turned out to be six years later. We tried to schedule it shortly after A GOOD FARMER's successful run, but we had to move from our original location. And then a little thing like a world-wide pandemic occurred. And then the various variants raised their heads. I can't honestly say how many times it has been on our calendar only to be re-scheduled.

But now, at long last, it is on our stage and I could not be happier. If you saw A GOOD FARMER, you know that Sharyn's work is infused with wit, keen insights and tons of heart. If you are seeing her work for the first time, you will see why we are so happy to have her back at ATG.

And so, at long last, we offer RIGHT TO BE FORGOTTEN. I love this play, and hope you will agree that it was worth the wait.

ATG staged her play, A Good Farmer, to wide acclaim in 2018. Her play By The Water was the recipient of the American Theater Critic's Association's prestigious Francesca Primus Prize. Rothstein is currently a writer and Co-Executive Producer on Orphan Black: Echoes, the spin-off of the sci-fi hit Orphan Black, soon to be on AMC. She was a writer/producer for the USA legal drama SUITS for many years. She teaches at NYU's Tisch School of Drama, where she received an MFA in Dramatic Writing.

American Theater Group (ATG) produces new and classic works primarily by American playwrights with an emphasis on the development of new works and the rediscovery of undeservedly neglected older ones. ATG engages audiences by making theater's glorious possibilities accessible to the diverse community in which we live, through remarkable performances as well as quality arts-in-education programming.

Since its founding in 2012, ATG has garnered much success. Our world premiere production of Marry Harry opened off–Broadway and was made into a movie. Following our world premiere of Bubble Boy by the authors of the hit films Despicable Me and The Lorax, and the hit TV show Schmigadoon!, the show has subsequently been licensed for productions around the world, recently released a cast album, and was presented at the prestigious Feinstein's/54 Below in New York.

Our New Works/New Voices program works with aspiring high school playwrights by teaming them up with an established playwright as their mentor and culminates with each of the students' plays being performed by professional actors. Our newest initiative, the ATG PlayLab, is a professional space for BIPOC (Black, Indigenous, People of Color) and LGBTQ+ playwrights with the goal of helping marginalized voices tell their rich and varied stores through theater.

Additionally, our respected high school DramaFest has served over 500 NJ students by providing an opportunity for them to perform excerpts from a production, receive critiques and engage in performing arts workshops led by industry professionals.

A fiscally sound organization, ATG has held a balanced budget and has not carried a deficit in our first 12 seasons.
